The Gumnut Awards program is a progressive rating scheme for holiday parks that recognises a demonstrated commitment to environmental sustainability and social responsibility.

This program is a large component of the CCIA's policy of being part of the environmental solution, rather than the cause of the problem, through the encouragement of Caravan Parks to develop an integrated Environmental Management Plan (EMP) incorporating the protection and enhancement of all environmental aspects of their park's surrounds.

Lakesia Park has continually progressed through the Gumnut Awards Program, having attained the Bronze Award on September 9<sup>th</sup> 2003, and achieving Silver Gumnut status on April 29<sup>th</sup> 2006.

Lakesia Park attained Gold Gumnut status in July 2007, and is now committed to maintaining that Gold level status, placing more emphasis on our environmental sustainability and social responsibility with the implementation of our Environmental Management Plan.

We at Lakesia have achieved Gold Gumnuts status, focussing on the major areas of:-

- ❖ wise water usage and waste water recycling;
- ❖ energy efficiency and passive solar energy design;
- ❖ support and collaboration with community groups, local council and resource management agencies on local and environmental matters;
- ❖ minimisation of both noise and air pollution;
- ❖ And, encouraging visitor's awareness and an appreciation of our surrounding environment, and promoting responsible actions towards it.
